SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **Entries for classes 1-9, 57 - 59 MUST reach the Secretary not later than Wednesday, 7th September. Entries will be accepted up to Show Day for all other classes.**
2. All Exhibitors must obey the order of the Steward. Refusal to do so will disqualify and make their exhibit liable for removal from the Showground.
3. **Exhibitors are requested to enclose their name and address in a small sealed envelope and attach to exhibit/plate as items may need to be moved for judging.**
4. All objections to be delivered in writing to the Secretary within one hour of the class being judged, with a deposit of £5 which shall be forfeited if the objection be considered frivolous. Stewards shall, where practicable, deal with objections.
5. Any breach of the Rules and Regulations of the Club, or Conditions of Entry, will render the Exhibitors liable to forfeit their prizes and be disqualified.
The decision of the Homecraft Committee shall be final and binding.
6. **Exhibits must not have been previously shown at this show and not be removed from the tent before 5.00pm.**
7. All exhibits are left at the exhibitor's own risk. The tent will be unattended after 6.00pm.
8. No prize to be awarded unless the judge considers there is sufficient merit and second prizes may be withdrawn unless three entries are received.
9. Each Exhibitor shall be solely responsible for and shall make good and repair any loss, damage, or injury caused by their exhibit or themselves and shall indemnify and hold blameless the Usk Farmers' Club Limited against any legal or other proceedings in regard thereto.
10. Every effort will be made to return entries to their rightful owners, but the Club will not in any case hold themselves responsible for the loss of/or damage to any exhibit or any person attending the Show.
11. The Challenge Trophies must be returned to the Secretary by Show Day and will be available to the 2016 winners after engraving (beginning of November). Failure to return any trophy will result in an invoice for replacement.
12. **All exhibits must arrive at the Homecraft Tent between 4:00pm and 6:00pm on Friday 9th September and 8:00am and 9.30 am on Saturday 10th September. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER 9:30AM.**
13. Entry Fees: 50p per class, Juniors 30p per class, except where stated. Cheques to be made payable to Usk Farmers' Club Ltd (minimum value £2).
14. Exhibits to be brought to site, NOT sent to the Homecraft Secretary's address.
15. The Show admission fee must be paid on entry to the showground and will be refunded if total class entry fees equal or exceed the cost of entering the showground, or at Secretary's discretion.

RECIPE:

100g (4oz) margarine

100g (4oz) demerara sugar

225g (8oz) mixed fruit

150ml (1/4pt) hot water

225g (8oz) S R flour

1 tsp mixed spice

½ tsp nutmeg

1 egg

7" round cake tin, greased & lined

METHOD

Put margarine, sugar, mixed fruit and water into a saucepan. Stir over low heat until melted. Bring to boil, simmer for 3 mins. Remove, cool, add rest of ingredients. Bake for about 1 hour at 300°F/160°C/Gas Mark 3.

21. NOVICE CLASS – LEMON DRIZZLE CAKE

RECIPE:

3 eggs
175g (6 oz) self-raising flour
175g (6 oz)caster sugar
175g (6 oz) softened butter
1 ½ level tsp baking powder
Finely grated zest of 1 lemon
For the drizzle:
100g (4 oz) granulated sugar
Juice of 1 lemon
900g (2lb) loaf tin, greased and lined

METHOD

Preheat the oven to 180°C/gas mark 4. Quick Mix Method – Beat together flour, baking powder, caster sugar, butter, eggs and lemon zest until smooth and turn into the prepared tin. Bake for approx 45 mins, or until golden brown, shrinking away from the sides of the tin and springy to the touch. While the cake is baking, make the topping:- Heat sugar and lemon juice together in a saucepan until the sugar dissolves. When cake comes out of the oven, pour drizzle syrup over and leave to cool in the tin.

10oz. plain flour	8oz. butter
4 eggs	8oz. light brown soft sugar
4oz. sultanas	1oz. blanched almonds
4oz. raisins	4oz. currants
grated rind of 1 lemon	2oz. candied peel
1tbs. milk	4oz. glacé cherries
2oz. split almonds	Round cake tin approx. 8in

METHOD

Cream the butter and sugar together until soft and light. Gradually add the beaten eggs. Sieve the dry ingredients together. Mix the chopped almonds, cherries, fruit and peel together. Fold in the flour and enough milk to make a slow dropping consistency, then lastly add the fruit. Put into a prepared tin, arrange split almonds on top and brush with a little egg white. Bake in a moderate oven 160°C Gas Mark 3 for 2½-3 hours until firm.

Icing Sugar to dust

Raisins, Dried Cranberries or any Dried Fruit, Nuts

Please tell us any additional ingredients you included or things you did differently. Remember if using additional ingredients to change the amount of biscuit and marshmallow so as to have enough mixture to cover them.

METHOD

1. Line a small to medium sized square baking tray with baking paper.
 2. Place biscuits into a freezer bag and bash with a rolling pin or just the side of your fist until they're broken into a mixture of everything between dust and 50p size lumps. Put this to one side.
 3. In a large saucepan melt the butter, chocolate and golden syrup over a gentle heat stirring it constantly until there are no or almost no more lumps of chocolate visible, then remove from the heat.
 4. Take biscuits, marshmallows and any additional delicious ingredients and pour into the pan of the chocolate mixture. Stir all this into the mixture until everything is completely covered.
 5. Tip the mixture into the lined baking tray, making sure you get it all, and spread the mixture out to the corners.
 6. Refrigerate this for 2 hours then dust with icing sugar and cut into fingers.
